

*Cordia macleodii* (Borala)



<b>Botanical Name</b>	<i>Cordia macleodii</i> (Griff.) (EHRETIACEAE)
<b>Vernacular Name</b>	Borala, Ghanti
<b>Description</b>	Leaves: Broadly ovate, shiny dark green on the dorsal surface and light green colored, Flowers: Yellowish white in color, polygamous, subsessile, in dense paniculate terminal and axillary tomentose cymes; male flowers with a rudimentary ovary but without style or stigma.
<b>Regional Distribution</b>	Similipal, Gandhamardan, Northern Ganjam, Karlapat (Kalahandi)
